**1. Mid-Year Report of St. Timothy Nursery and Primary School Nzara Diocese 2017.**

**Introduction:**

The School administration registered a total of 924 pupils at the beginning of the year 2017. Our official school term begun on the 8<sup>th</sup> February, 2017 with classes.

2) Travel for three teachers (Kampala to Nzara by road to Juba and back to Kampala) £ 700  
Three Teachers travelled from Uganda to Nzara Through Juba

1. Tr. Rose Nelima Kampala to Nzara via Juba (she has 1 year baby boy) £ 250
2. Tr. Grace Amanio Kampala to Nzara via Juba £ 200
3. Tr. Milka Agucha Kampala to Nzara via Juba £ 200

3) Visa for three teachers for a year £ 100 x 3= £ 300

NB: Each of the above paid \$100 for visa and total was \$400 including the child of Tr. Rose. They had two nights in Juba ECS Guest House to wait for the flight to Yambio.

There five untrained teachers are South Sudanese whom we aspire to train. We had initially decided to train the teachers who are South Sudanese who have just completed their senior four levels (S.4) and senior 6. The Three out of the four trained teachers are Ugandans, and one is South Sudanese fully trained in Nursery Education in Uganda. One of the five untrained teachers was sent to Yei for Teachers training. The teacher we sent to Yei is called Ms. Nome Azuo Elisapa whom you sponsor could not continue with her studies, we are planning to enrol her for the same training in Africa Renewal University in Uganda; instead of Yei Teachers Training College; which we are not sure when it will reopen. We do have the balance of **\$500** in the diocesan account. The tuition and board is 1500 per year, she will need an extra \$ 300 for transport to Uganda by commercial airline not MAF. MAF is expensive. She will use 100 USD from Yambio to Juba, Juba to Nimule 100 USD, Then 50 USD by road from Nimule to the School, and 50 dollars for visa to enter Uganda.

For Her we are asking for 1300 USD and for the second teacher James Karaba William who going to join the same school. This is because we do not want her to go on her own, they can encourage each other while there. We will forward the forms filled for the admission and will send to you the letters of admission once we get them. They are suppose to start at the end of August 2017. For James Karaba we are asking for 1800 USD. This can be paid in two instalments.

**Parents' Contribution to support and supplement of the School**

Despite the famine, starvation in Nzara the parents are committed to contribute towards porridge and rice to be cooked for their children in school.

### Challenges

- The five classes which are studying under mango trees were seriously disturbed by rain during their exams. We had to take them to the cathedral, but the church was so full that it was hard to control

### Way forward;

- Need to send wo teachers to Africa Renewal University for bachelor degree in education by August 2017.
- Need for a Laptop for the administrator

### 1. Diawo Nursery and Primary School

The School have continued to progress. There are four classes this year 2016, with only three untrained teachers. The School administrator has visited the school to monitor progress thrice this year 2016. The numbers of pupils this year is 48 (19 boys and 29 girls). The number have decreased compared to last year is because of the parents refusing to send their children due to insecurity in the area.
